CARBON TAX, CARBON TRADE AND RENEWABLE ENERGY

Our Manitoba Premier, Brian Pallister, has not signed any agreement on carbon pricing, a pan-Canadian agreement to curb carbon emissions because he wants "a made-in-Manitoba" plan. Have you thought of writing him a letter? You could...

- express your concern about global warming and its effect on polar bears as well as on coastal communities;
- affirm that humanity needs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by reducing consumption of fossil fuels (see Laudato Si nos 23-26);
- express you opinion about carbon pricing and possibly point out limits of carbon tax and carbon trade (see Laudato Si no. 171- 173);
- encourage our government to support development of renewable energies: wind, solar, biomass...
- affirm that Manitoba has a good source of clean energy in hydro-electric power.
