Microplastics are the result of the breakdown of all the plastic waste that makes its way into landfills and oceans.

Did you know? Microplastics were found in 93% of bottled water tested in a global study. Manitoba Rivers feed 400M pieces of microplastic into Lake Winnipeg every year. Sarah Warrack, a master's student at the University of MB found microplastics at every site she sampled on the Assiniboine and Red Rivers — The Forks had the most — and the stuff turned up in nearly every fish she dissected.
